Key Considerations for Cycle Lanes and Cycle Paths The difference between a cycle lane and a cycle path as defined by Greater Manchester Cycling Design Guidance & Standards documentation is that: A cycle lane is "segregated from pedestrians but not physically segregated from motorised vehicles along the full length of the cycle lane."
