2. Formulations and uses. For oral use CHX comes in several different formulations. In the United Kingdom (UK) and Europe 0.2% CHX mouthwash (Corsodyl™) is available over the counter (OTC), as either an alcohol-containing or non-alcohol formulation. 0.2% tends to be recommended for short-term intensive plaque control, whereas 0.06% is referred to as a daily rinse.

BCD Amiodarone causes prolongation of the QT interval, which can precipitate dysrhythmia. Antidysrhythmic medications cause changes in cardiac rhythm and rate; therefore monitoring of heart rate and rhythm is needed.Electrolyte depletion, specifically potassium and magnesium, may predispose to further dysrhythmia.
