What Is Shin Hanga? — Collecting Japanese Prints

A student of the bijin-ga painter Kiyokata Kaburagi, Kiyoshi Kobayakawa concentrated on delicate depictions of beautiful women across painting and print. At times, he broke from bijin-ga convention and portrayed his subjects in the styles of the early 20 th century, such as dressed western clothes or smoking cigarettes.

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
