The scale's split into two easy to remember patterns. On the G and D strings, the first and second fingers are a whole note apart, whilst the third finger is just a half note away. Think of this as: stretched, stretched, close. On the E and A strings, the middle finger is close to the first finger, whilst the third finger is a whole note away.

While the violin does not have frets like a guitar, the right note is produced if the instrument is properly tuned and the string is pressed in the right position. However, being able to press the string down in the right position all the time requires practice. A number is assigned to each of the fingers of the left hand that press the strings. The index finger is 1, the middle finger is 2, the ring finger 3, and the little finger 4.

Once you've tuned your violin, place your first finger about two inches down from the top of the fingerboard on the G string and pluck the string. Look at your tuner and move your finger around until the tuner reads A and lights up green with the tuner needle in the middle of the dial signifying that your A is in tune.

This finger placement affects the pitch of the notes that you play - that is, whether they have a higher pitch, or a lower one. Intonation is extremely important because it affects how good the piece will end up sounding. Just like when you are playing the piano, you will deal with half-steps and full-steps.

Marking the spot for finger 1. If you use tape to mark your fingerboard guides, cut a length of tape that is long enough for the ends to meet when you stick the tape across the fingerboard and around the violin's neck. In other words, the tape's length should slightly exceed the circumference of the violin's neck.
