Climax comes from the Greek word meaning “staircase” and “ladder”. Now you can see why the five parts of a story are often depicted like this:

Here's a quick and simple definition: The climax of a plot is the story's central turning point—the moment of peak tension or conflict—which all the preceding plot developments have been leading up to.
