pH and Acidity of Ammonium Chloride (NH₄Cl) Aqueous Solution. Aqueous ammonium chloride (NH₄Cl) solution is acidic and show pH value less than seven. But aqueous NH₄Cl solution is a weak acidic solution. For acidity, ammonium ion is the reason. In the water, ammonium chloride dissociates completely to NH₄⁺ and Cl⁻ ions.

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
