There is no doubt that Shelley's poetry suffers from vagueness, but to say that it lacks any substance is to do injustice to a great poet. Shelley has been haunted by visions since childhood. In Hymn to Intellectual Beauty he refers to his boyhood when he looked for ghosts through 'many a listening chamber, cave, and ruin' At no period of his life was he fully free from vision.
